History of the 50th Infantry Division (United States) The history of the 50th Infantry Division (United States) (also known as the Motorized Division, 50th Infantry Division, or 50th Motorized Infantry Division) is traced from its creation in 1941, when it was established in the Philippines, to the end of World War II in 1945. World War II The 50th Infantry Division was formed at Fort Shafter on Oahu, Hawaii, on 10 July 1941, as part of the Army's Hawaiian Department. During the early part of World War II, the 50th Division was part of the Hawaiian Department, before being transferred to the Western Defense Command under the control of the III Corps. By July 1943, the 50th Division was at Fort Lawton, Washington, where it was under the command of the VII Corps. The 50th Division was then transferred to the Western U.S. Defense Command as the 50th, 79th and 94th Infantry Divisions (a formation, which never happened). At the end of the war, it was in the Central Pacific theater. The division was officially disbanded on 14 September 1945, in Tokyo, Japan. After World War II After World War II, the 50th Infantry Division was reactivated in the U.S. Army Reserve on 8 October 1945 at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. It was trained with a peacetime mission and known as "Prairie Division" until 1950. Many members of the 50th returned to civilian life and chose to join the United States Army Reserve. The 50th Infantry Division was then inactivated in the Army Reserve on 30 October 1950. Reactivation The 50th Infantry Division (United States) was reactivated on 30 April 1985 at Fort Polk, Louisiana, and assigned to the US Army III Corps as the "Motorized Division," as part of the US Army Reserve. As a motorized division, the 50th
