Carmen Rosa Carmen Rosa (born 8 January 1963) is a Spanish former tennis player who played for Spain in Fed Cup competition. She was runner-up in the Spanish Open in 1980, and competed in four consecutive editions of the Wimbledon Championships. She was also the runner-up in the 1982 German Open. Tennis career Rosa played amateur tennis in Spain until 1989. She made her professional debut in 1989 at the age of 26. Rosa's first tournament on the WTA Tour was the 1990 Virginia Slims Championships where she reached the singles final, but lost to Conchita Martínez. She played for Spain in Fed Cup competition for two years, 1992–1994. She won her first Fed Cup rubber in 1992, defeating Nathalie Tauziat in the opening singles. In 1993, she partnered with top-seeded Dominique Van Roost and defeated Van Roost and Helena Suková in the doubles. Rosa was a doubles runner-up at the 1994 Virginia Slims of Newport. She won the doubles title with Mary Pierce in 1992, Renee Richards in 1993, and Rosalyn Fairbank in 1994. She also made the finals of the 1984 Italian Open, the 1986 Bausch & Lomb Championships with Anne Minter, the 1991 Swiss Open with Rosalyn Fairbank and 1988 U.S. Open with Tara Snyder. In 1982, Rosa reached the final of the German Open, defeating reigning World No. 1 Martina Navratilova in the semis.
